We welcome feedback from birthing people, partners and family members around their experiences of maternity care and services received across Rochdale and Oldham.



The Rochdale and Oldham Maternity Voices partnership (ROMVP) was newly reformed in May 2021, and it has gone from strength to strength over the last 6 months.

The aim of the Rochdale and Oldham MVP is for a range of people to come together to review, improve and codesign maternity care and services locally to meet the needs of local women, parents, birthing people and families in the Rochdale and Oldham area.

The ROMVP works in partnership with Healthwatch Rochdale with support via Healthwatch Oldham, as well as representatives from charities and other organisations that support local families.

Feedback is key for the ROMVP, this way services can improve, or shape further work by listening to the service user's voice. In order to help gather feedback efficiently, there has been two successful recruitment drives and there are now 10 ROMVP Volunteer Advocates.

Maternity Services Feedback Link: https://healthwatchrochdale.org.uk/share-yourexperience-local-maternity-services The Volunteer Advocates not only help gather crucial feedback; they share important information via social media, take part in focus groups, surveys, questionnaires, and consultations. There will be a third recruitment drive in the New Year and we are hoping to recruit Advocates who are bi-lingual.

There are also still many inequalities in Maternity care and services for ladies from ethnic backgrounds, we are currently gathering in feedback specifically from South Asian Ladies on their experiences, what went well and what improvements could be made to services. Shaping the Future

Work alongside us...

Healthwatch Rochdale and RADDAG have been commissioned by HMR CCG to carry out Year 3 of the Engage Project, which aims to improve access to local healthcare and wellbeing services for refugees and asylum seekers.

We are looking to work with professionals, organisations and groups to ensure that we can:

- Coproduce awareness raising materials for Refugee and Asylum Seekers on accessing health care services to reduce dependency on A&E
- Coproduce a language/communication guide for GP's to enable better communication with patients who are refugee and asylum seekers.
- Deliver awareness sessions with existing groups and organisations to ensure that refugee and asylum seekers understand their rights when accessing health care services.

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Engagement & Involvement

Finding the right service can be worrying and stressful. Healthwatch Rochdale plays an important role in not just gathering in feedback, but helping people to get the information they need to take control of their health and care locally and find services that will provide them with the right support within the Rochdale Borough.

Healthwatch Rochdale have a number of information, advice and signposting sessions across the Rochdale Boroughs. We are on hand to not only gather your feedback about services within the borough, but we can also give you further information, advice on where to go for help or signpost you to services such as the Rochdale Advocacy hub, who can deal with NHS Complaints.

Want to know what happens after you contact us with your feedback?

Here are just a few actions we have taken following speaking to members of the public.



Care Home Feedback

We were contacted by a concerned family member of a resident in a local care home regarding a lack of gas supply.

We contacted adult safeguarding and within 24 hours the care home received a visit to ensure correct procedures were being followed and the residents were well looked after.



Mental Health Feedback

We listened to a patient who was in distress with their mental health. After listening to what they had to say we encouraged them to speak to their GP.

We made a follow up call 4 weeks later, they were so pleased we encouraged them and said they felt much better after receiving the right medication.



Dentistry Feedback

We helped a resident who was waiting to start preventative cancer treatment.

The treatment could not take place until her dental needs were taken care of.

The resident was struggling to find a dentist who could assist, we raised concerns as the lack of dentistry was delaying cancer treatment. We managed to facilitate an appointment locally for her within a week

Volunteering with Healthwatch

Healthwatch Rochdale volunteers make a huge difference to the work we do and play a vital role in helping local people have their say on health and social care. Volunteering with Healthwatch can help you develop skills, gain experience and make a difference to your community.



Advisory Group

The Healthwatch Rochdale Advisory Group of volunteers make recommendations to the board on possible areas of work or research which has been highlighted through trends analysis or community engagement and Feedback.

The Advisory Group currently has several members from across the Rochdale Borough with a variety of passions, experience and interests.

The group collectively and meaningfully contribute to quality improvements of local services by ensuring the patients voice and lived experiences are shared with providers, commissioners and residents of the Rochdale borough.

This group currently meets bimonthly via Zoom.

Youthwatch

Youthwatch Rochdale is for young people age between 13 and 18 years old who either live, work or study in the Rochdale Borough. There are 10 newly recruited Youthwatch Volunteers who play a key role in assisting Healthwatch Rochdale by promoting the services they offer, gathering feedback and by being the eyes and ears of Healthwatch as a young person representative.

Youthwatch members meet virtually each month via Zoom and this gives the young people a chance to give any feedback around health and social care services, raise any issues, share their views on things and invite guest speakers to speak about issues relevant to the young people. This is an amazing opportunity to build skills, be part of a team, get rewards and recognition, meet new people, and be the voice for young people within the community.

Young people are also recognised and rewarded for their commitment to Youthwatch Rochdale. When they have participated in five meetings or focus groups, they receive a £25 voucher of their choice.

ROMVP

The role of a ROMVP Advocate is flexible and the specifics will depend on your skills, experience, time and interests. This role is voluntary.

ROMVP Advocates are usually expected to attend most of the quarterly MVP meetings. The next one is in January 2022 and then again in March 2022.

The ROMVP are looking for diverse and passionate individuals to volunteer their time to help gather feedback from our communities on their experiences of maternity services in Rochdale and Oldham and to promote/raise awareness of ROMVP via their own networks and social media.

Healthwatch Rochdale received a grant from Action Together to host an event to thank their Volunteers for all that they do for our organisation and to bring them back together after a very uncertain year due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

The staff and volunteers were joined by the Mayor of Rochdale, Councillor Aasim Rasheed for afternoon tea, a quiz, bingo, conversations and plenty of laughter.

It was lovely to see our volunteers face to face once more and special thanks to the staff at The Flying Horse, Rochdale for their hospitality.

Did you know?

- Healthwatch Rochdale currently have 20 volunteers.
- Our longest serving volunteer has been with the organisation over 6 years.
- There are numerous volunteering roles which include Advisory Group members, Volunteer Advocates for the Rochdale and Oldham Maternity Voices Partnership, Board Members, Social Media Volunteer, Admin Volunteer, Youthwatch and Enter & View Reps.
- Since January 2021, our volunteers have spent a magnificent 337 hours volunteering for us.
- We have online Zoom catch ups to share updates on our work but also to give our volunteers a chance to catch up with each other.
- Volunteers are the heart of our organisation.

Vital support in place for households in need this winter

Rochdale Borough Council has put in place a support programme to help thousands of vulnerable residents and families with essentials this winter.

As a key part of its support offer, the council is using £2.3 million from the government's Household Support Fund to provide:-

•Targeted support for low-income households, through provision of free school meals for eligible families over the Christmas holiday, February half-term and Easter holiday

•Delivery of a household fund, where people can access shopping and fuel vouchers

•Targeted support for older residents in receipt of council tax support

•A package of housing energy support

The council will also be working with partners across the borough, including the voluntary sector, community groups and charities, to ensure those most in need receive targeted assistance.

Older residents who qualify for council tax support have already been contacted by the council and will receive their first payment by Friday 17 December 2021, benefitting over 7,000 households. Additionally, the borough's successful community warehouse, which has been in place throughout the pandemic, will continue to provide food parcels, cleaning products, nappies, baby food and other essential supplies for families and older people.

Councillors have ensured food vouchers will continue to be provided for lower income families over Christmas, February half-term and Easter. Families will be contacted directly, and it will be targeted at over 12,500 children in the borough eligible for free school meals or identified through children's services. In addition, the Holiday Activity Fund will be running over Christmas, providing activities and food for children on free school meals.

Households who are in particular need are being encouraged to get in touch, to see what assistance could be available for them.
