6	ROMVP Volunteer Advocate updates Open Discussion	Jess, Hyperemesis Gravidarum (HG)	Shared story at a quarterly meeting and via the Open Day at Oldham. Gave Sid (Engagement Midwife) Case Study account of experience and Husbands of HG. Part of a task and finish group, also incorporated service user feedback gathered as ROMVP. Trust now working with service users and actively listening to them and ensuring involved from a lived experience perspective. Working on guidelines, making information simpler, specific steps dependant of severity.	





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		Working with Royal College of Gynaecology guideline. Work done on the "Puqe" Scoring to ensure that Mental Health Aspect included and ensure used as a assessment tool. Mental health is a huge focus as women have been diagnosed with PTSD, and had trouble bonding due to the extremity of their HG. IMPACT that is huge is that there is now a 72 hour window open door plan for HG sufferers for continuity of care as well as IV therapy to be effective. Looking at getting specific HG nurses/advocates, improving training around HG, when things have been brought to table, been beneficial to get there and then feedback and insight.		
	Antonia March with Midwives	Working with midwives/doulas etc across Greater Manchester and Eastern Cheshire. Issues raised on Midwife/staffing with Mike Raeve and meetings been had with Andy Burnham Mayor. Lots of key people involved. Comments made from the top were that they didn't realise how bad services were and the impact the lack of maternity staff was having specifically on the mental health of parents and staff. Maternity – preconception to 5 years old, key priority at the Greater Manchester Integrated Care Board, population health model.
