Gives a platform for feedback, escalations, praise, concerns, information. Round table discussions – antenatal, postnatal, midwives and they also update. Patient Experience meet ups ensuring wider reach and diversity of voice. • CQC Visit – held conversations report live from December 22. There are a lot of pointers in the report which is quite a difficult read in parts, and the "requires Improvement" was around things such as: staff training, appraisals, staff levels, storage of medications. Chair said that she knows already via the Maternity Improvement Programme that issues raised are already being dealt with and progress being made to rectify issues. She is confident that the Trust are doing all they can to fix. There are monthly meetings in place, round table discussions where the ROMVP feedback is shared, any feedback gathered goes directly to the Trust, and the meetings are also minuted and an action log in place. Also have weekly meetings with Patient Experience Team.

• Infant Mortality Steering Group- Safer Sleep – big campaigns around this and reducing risks. Thermometers available. Awareness around cosleeping. In Oldham rates of Infant mortality are quite bad and Chair working alongside Public Health, they are seeing what can be done to reduce numbers.



Aim to bridge gaps in service user feedback and identify key priorities. Chair congratulated Josie, Vice Chair, on the recent birth of her little girl. **Vice Chair Update** Raising the profile of ROMVP by being out on the ground and attending a variety of baby sessions in local community spaces in Oldham and Rochdale including the Oldham Childrens Centres. Enjoyed being out.

QUESTION: Jess – Will the midwives be receiving training on hyperemesis gravidarum and will the treatment guidelines be updated by the Trust? I suffered with two pregnancies. Referred to gyni service. Offered termination which refused. Offered medications that had dire side effects. Despite plans in place – midwife knowledge out of date especially around keytones.

Response: Firstly apologies for this and the way that you felt. If you could please share your story in more depth we can look further into this to help with improvements to services. We have looked now at holistic therapies to treat HG as well as individualising care plans. The Trust guidelines are very specific in the diagnosis and management of HG.

Leona – HG was raised and a key theme at one of our quarterly meetings, it is apparent that there is still work needed around this topic. The Trust did say they would work with us around raising awareness on Instagram.

Badgernet – Phase 1 has rolled out, Phase 2 implemented from Mid February '23. This has had challenges as a new service – digital maternity notes that has replaced the paper green notes. We have given training on this to staff, it should be









accessible in all Trust buildings, the badgernet will be of great benefit once teething problems ironed out.

Oldham Birth Centre - Newly appointed staff. (Kate - antenatal and Claire community midwife) Integrated staffing models. Birth Centre aims to be back open and available to mothers. Has been closed on occasion due to staffing levels. Looking at an enhanced recovery system around elective caesarean sections. Triage to be more streamlined. Home births being more readily available. Vickie- I planned on having a home birth, wanted to stay at home. Midwife thought baby breech. I ended up not having delivery wanted and feel let down. **QUESTION:** Do any of the community midwives have access and training around a mobile scanner?

RESPONSE: Looking at the bigger picture in that there is extensive training needed around sonography and cost of equipment. There is currently new training being given within units ongoing (Triage/foetal medicine)

We are trying our hardest to attract more staff, more holistic offers and looking at Hypnobirthing and Aqua natal offers.

QUESTION: Vickie- Has the acupuncture now been paused?









			Josie – I'm a massive advocate for the birth centre acupuncture, it was brilliant for me over the last few weeks of my pregnancy. RESPONSE: There is currently only one member of staff who can run it, we are keen to keep the service going. There are ongoing discussions to develop this offer and upskill/train other staff as it is a high demand offer. QUESTION: Ruth -Do you currently have an offer around hypnobirthing? I am a qualified hypnobirthing teacher and am happy to offer my services. RESPONSE: No current offer, standard antenatal classes are running out on a basic level. Hypnobirthing was stopped due to the covid pandemic and we have since had staffing issues. Will be something we can add to the new Antenatal programme being developed.

Update: There are currently very basic antenatal classes reset up on Saturdays – it is recognised that they are not perfect, but working towards ensuring they can be made better.

The new antenatal programme put on hold. Need to be realistic around it, staffing shortages, time capacity are main factors in holding this. There is also an ask of Health Visitors in the work and again staffing shortages.

There will be focus groups set up which were originally aimed for end of January '23. ROMVP to be informed of new dates which is looking at towards end March '23. New programme wants to ensure that it is a gold standard programme and all areas covered to ensure the best start in maternity/baby journey.


Jen: There are currently ad-hoc sessions of basic antenatal classes and education being held by the good will of staff. They are currently approx every other Saturday and open for people when are a specific gestation – 28-34 weeks.

Lots of work gone into new offer. Working closely to ensure asking and delivering relevant and helpful areas of information. You can take tours of birthing centre and labour suite via the current antenatal class offer.
